Building your digital skills



The [Alberta Digital Literacy Program](#) is a free, self-guided online resource that can help caregivers build confidence with everyday digital skills.

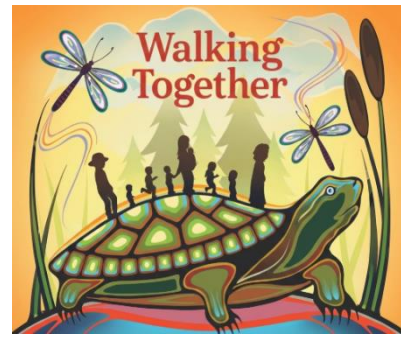
